1. Commissioner Gilmore's Report – Commissioner Gilmore read the monthly reports as submitted by the Fire and Police Departments (reports attached). He also read highlights from the Construction Office monthly report. Commissioner Greenwald also commended local resident, Stephanie Gies, for receiving an appointment to the United States Naval Academy.

3. Engineers Report – Joe Federici reported on the following:
 - His office is finalizing the Streetscape Phase II plans and will be re-submitting them to the DOT
 - Harding Avenue pump station and generator project—the generator testing is complete and the project should be finalized very soon.

3. Mayor's Report – The Mayor read the Tax Collector's report and reported total receipts of \$322,535.25 were collected during the month of July for tax and various miscellaneous charges (copies attached). Mayor Wolk also read the CFO's report for August (copy attached). He added that he too extends congratulations to Stephanie Gies on her appointment to the Naval Academy and added that an article about her will be in the Messenger. He wished everyone a safe and happy Labor Day weekend.
