REPORTS:

Commissioner Gilmore read highlights from the Fire Department and the Police Department monthly reports for July. He added that the Fire Department did a great job saving the residence at Hill Street and Kings Highway when the attached garage caught fire. He also said we hope Officer Schaffer continues to get well. He broke a finger on the job. He hopes all is well with everyone else.

Commissioner Greenwald read the highlights from the Construction Department for the month of July. In DPW, there were again no accidents or injuries. Single stream recycling was over 76,700 pounds. We are 57.33 tons of trash less than last year at this time. We received notice of grant money for mulch at the parks. Turned benches for July 4 parade and repaired inlets that collapsed on Eighth Avenue

Engineer Joe Federici reported that their office has finalized the plans and specifications for the Hartka Avenue project which is being funded by a DOT grant and that the project will be advertised shortly. We also received notice that the DOT 2012 grant application period is opened and they will be preparing applications for Idora and Grant Avenues.

Mayor Wolk read the receipt totals from the Tax Collector report for the month of June, 2011. Tax bills have gone out and he thanked the office staff for getting the bills in record time. Good work to Marie and everyone in the office. Marie Darlington added that they did a terrific job and we are lucky to have such a good staff.
