## INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE DISPOSAL OF WATER BASED LATEX PAINT

Latex paint is non-hazardous and should not be brought to the Camden County Household Special Waste Collections. It can be disposed of in the regular trash, provided it is first dried out.

## Following these simple steps, you can dispose of latex paint in the trash, year round.

- 1. Check the label for an indication that the paint is latex or cleans up with "soap and water".
- 2. Gather the following materials; cardboard box, strong plastic trash bag, kitty litter or sand.
- 3. Place a cardboard box on the ground. Place a strong plastic bag inside the box, fitting the open ends of the bag over the sides of the box. Place a small amount of sand or kitty litter into the plastic bag.
- 4. Open the paint can and pour the paint into the plastic bag with the kitty litter/sand, adding more kitty litter/sand, if needed. Mix together.
- 5. Wait for kitty litter/sand to absorb the paint. This may take from a few hours to a few days depending on weather conditions and the amount of paint.
- 6. When the paint is **<u>fully dry</u>**, pull the ends of the plastic trash bag together and secure tightly. Discard the bag into the trash.
- 7. Allow the residue inside the empty paint can to harden and dispose of the can in the trash.
